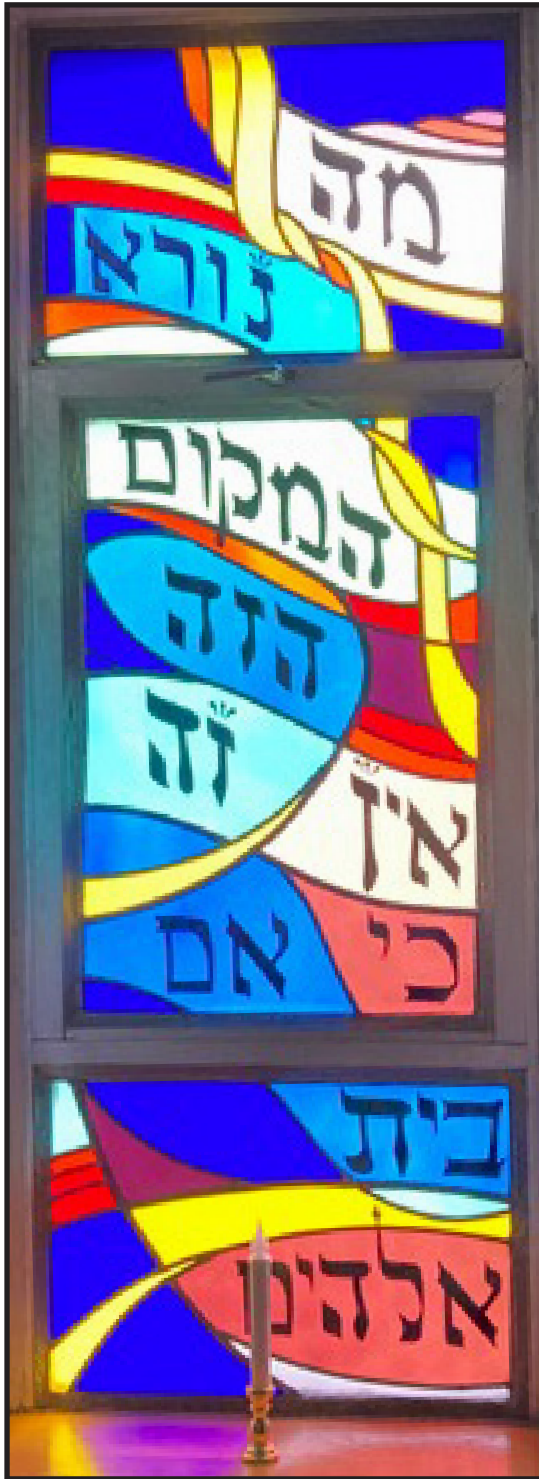

## A Message from Rabbi Tom: New Beginnings

I am excited to be joining the CKA community as your new rabbi this August. To start this relationship with a foundation of meeting each other where we are at spiritually, Jewishly. Where we can inspire, challenge and encourage each other to get closer to living B'Tzelem Eloheem, literally, as Mirrors of the Divine.

First and Foremost, I am deeply grateful to the so many of you who have helped to make this transitional process as seamless as is possible. All transitions are difficult at best, and all too often absolutely daunting, leaving us with questions, doubts, and fears of the unknown.

Our beautiful Torah teaches that while times of transitions might indeed feel overwhelming, it is precisely during these in-between phases when communities can flourish.

Near the beginning of the Torah, Abraham hears a call from God: "Go, leave yourself, leave your land, your father's house, and go to a land that I will show you... and you will be a source of blessing." (Genesis 12:1) Abraham is literally told to "leave himself." To go beyond all that is familiar, all assumptions, and to travel to an undetermined destination.

The great Jewish mystic, Rabbi Yehudah Aryeh Leib Alter, AKA the Sefat Emet, (1847-1905, Poland) interprets Abraham's story this way: "Go to the land that I will show you... where your potential will be realized in unpredictable ways." That when we leave the comfort, the familiar, when we head into our own personal and collective untamed wildernesses, that is when and where we can begin to encounter the voice of God, the Divine within each and every one of us.

The High Holidays are just around the corner. On Rosh Hashana we will blow the Shofar and announce, Hayom Harat Olam, today is the world's birthday. Today is Bereisheet, the time of new and exciting and yes, scary, Beginnings.

With this in mind, perhaps we can find encouragement from those ever-relevant words of the great Hassidic master, Rabbi Nachman of Brestlov (1772-1810 Ukraine): Kol ha'olam kulo gesher tzar me'od, vеха'ikar lo le'fached klal, "All the world is a very narrow bridge, and the most important thing is not to be overwhelmed by fear."

These words speak a great truth: That life is so very precarious, and so very precious. The saving grace, Rabbi Nachman was teaching us throughout the generations, is we do not have to go through this process alone. That we are indeed at our strongest when we care for one another in times of need, B'Agudah Echat, as a united community.

I look forward to sharing these Yamim Noraim, Days of Awe with CKA, and wish you and your families a Ketiva v'Chatima Tova, May we all be written in God's Book of Life for a year of blessing, fulfillment, and of peace.

**Expanded Scrip**

Twice a year we have an expanded scrip sale. We purchase, preordered by you, gift cards from most every place imaginable for your use. We make various amounts depending on the store. It ranges from 2% to 9%.

**House Report**

Now that CKA is planning more normal activities, here is a bullet point description of what has or is in the process of occurring to the building since last June.

**AIR MOVEMENT** – Two roof exhaust fans were installed last summer which are now operating and have a timing sequence similar to our outside lighting. The fan operation can be started at any time by staff when needed, however they must be turned off before leaving the building. Two manually operated vents installed in the Sadinsky Room are now open and will remain so. When cooler weather arrives, all will be shut down. The ERV "Energy Recovery Ventilator" installed in the small sanctuary is functioning properly but must be turned on and off manually as needed.

**PLUMBING LOWER LEVEL** – Has been updated in areas that were needed for safety.



KITCHEN AND MAIN LEVEL BATHROOM EXHAUST FANS - Installed and working well.

SANCTUARY - Now that we have new carpeting, seats, audio/visual equipment and controls we have saved all the pew and seat plaques and rededicated them in the main Sanctuary.

LIGHTING – Several bulbs needed to be replaced throughout the building and Stuart Trock was able to address 90 to 95% of them. A few may need replacing. We must decide what type of replacement is best for the future. The Social Hall needs new lighting, and we must decide what product is best for our needs.

EXTERIOR RAILING – It's recently been noted that our railing by our back ramp and stair access needs some attention and Lee Kosow has a plan to address it.

LAWN/LANDSCAPING – A contact was made through Fran Jankowski for Lawn/Landscaping and snow removal service by Kyle Burns of Erin NY. I've met with Kyle, and he has agreed to continue that service. Both Stuart and Jim have or will have his contact information also.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL – We're looking into changing our container size for ease of disposal.

ROOF LEAKS – Earlier this year, Stuart Trock met with Jason Weigand from Hale Roofing and has had the leaks repaired. We hope to have a twice-yearly examination of our roof to help alleviate problems. Secondly, the tile in the old main level bathrooms is not replaceable and will need to be painted before the High Holidays. We will be reaching out soon.

KEYS & KEY FOBS – A note was sent out for information on who has Keys or Key Fobs with access to the building. The office and House will be clarifying access to the building soon.

Secondly, our longtime locksmith Clinton Fudge passed away last May. So, at some point we will need to find a new locksmith and make him or her aware of our current situation.

WATER FOUNTAINS – House was approached by Sisterhood a few months ago to look into upgrading drinking fountains and drinking access in the lower level. Quotes were supplied but no action yet. As to the Lower level it became more complicated due to no drainage there so, a stand-alone unit was suggested.

INTERIOR RAIL – A Suggestion was given to House to have made and install a railing in the center of the steps leading to the Bimah for ease of ascending and descending. Further discussion will be needed by the new Rabbi and Ritual Committee concerning placement and use for services as well as style and safety.

MAINTENANCE BOOK – On a suggestion by Marjorie Hamilton the House Committee has started a Power Point book that will have pictures, descriptions, and current source of agencies/contractors that have either installed, or have worked on, or maintain the many elements of our infrastructure. In this fashion it can be updated for future House Committee Chairs and or members.

We focused on bringing the community back together in pardon after COVID restrictions were lifted to support the activities of Sisterhood and CKA. It was good to see one another face to face again. We are ever mindful of the purpose of Sisterhood of CKA which "shall be to foster and maintain the ideals of Judaism. Sisterhood shall promote fellowship among its members and support religious, social, educational, and communal activities of the congregation. In addition, Sisterhood shall contribute to the aesthetics of the building."

#### *Sisterhood Events and Programs:*

**9/20/22** Opening Meeting "Getting to Net Zero: Carbon Fee & Dividend and Supporting Policies" Kelly Smith-Frank from Citizen's Climate Education. It was encouraging to hear that there are things our politicians and we can all do to slow the impact of climate change.



**10/5/22** Yom Kippur Break-the-Fast. Our first post-COVID in person at CKA.

**1/7/23** Trivia Night. Back by popular demand. The co-emcees were John Goldman and Mindy Gaieski. The Golden Age of Hollywood theme was wonderful as bedazzled participants took to the red carpet to accept their prizes.

**3/17/23** Sisterhood Shabbat. Our first post COVID in person at CKA. 24 Sisterhood members participated in the service while Marcia Kesten gave the sermon.

**4/6/23** Second Night Seder. Sisterhood was asked to take the responsibility for the Second Night Seder this year and we stepped up to the challenge. We decided to reduce the price from \$20 to \$18 (Chai) for an adult and \$9 for a child. It was important that everyone felt that cost was not a barrier to attending. The average charge for a Second Night Seder this year was \$72 nationwide, so we were well below. Also, we decided to ask for donations regardless of whether you attended. We served a traditional kosher brisket meal with 65 people attending. In total we had \$366 in donations, so the net cost to Sisterhood was \$152.

**6/6/23** Donor Dinner/Annual Meeting. We all enjoyed John Goldman's presentation of "2022 Bike Tour: Great Vistas and Great People" cycling coast to coast. Many of the CKA community read his daily blog from August – November as he made his way across the country on his bicycle. It was interesting to see an overview of the trip. There were over 50 people in attendance for a fun evening.

#### *CKA Events:*

The Sisterhood Board voted to take responsibility and pay for the following five CKA events:

- Rosh Hashanah Luncheon
- Yom Kippur Break-the-Fast
- Hanukkah Celebration
- Shabbat Across America Dinner
- Second Night Seder

We all wear many hats, but assuring CKA is a strong community is most important to all of us.

#### *Fundraising:*

The other major focus of the CKA Sisterhood is to support the congregation financially. This past year we contributed \$4,500. We continued our fundraising activities which included Double Triangle, Challah Sale, Gift Shop, and Greeting Card Sale. The traditional Jewish Food Festival continued as a Nosh of the Month sale. The entire community looked forward to buying their special treat every month, enjoying the following items from the JFF menu: Sept. Kugel; Oct. Knishes; Nov. Rugelach.

#### *Community Involvement:*

We have started collecting medicine bottles that we usually recycle or throw away so they can be used again. As part of the Matthew 25 Ministries in which many churches participate, empty pill bottles are collected, stripped of all labels, washed, and sent to countries where there may be none. There, medicine is often given to patients in their hands, pockets, or a piece of paper. Sisterhood donated \$180 to help with shipping costs. It is so important to be a part of the larger world beyond ourselves, our congregation, our community, our country...and to be a part of the movement to reduce, reuse, and recycle. Together we can use our energies and strengths to accomplish so much.

None of this would have been possible without the work of these dedicated women.

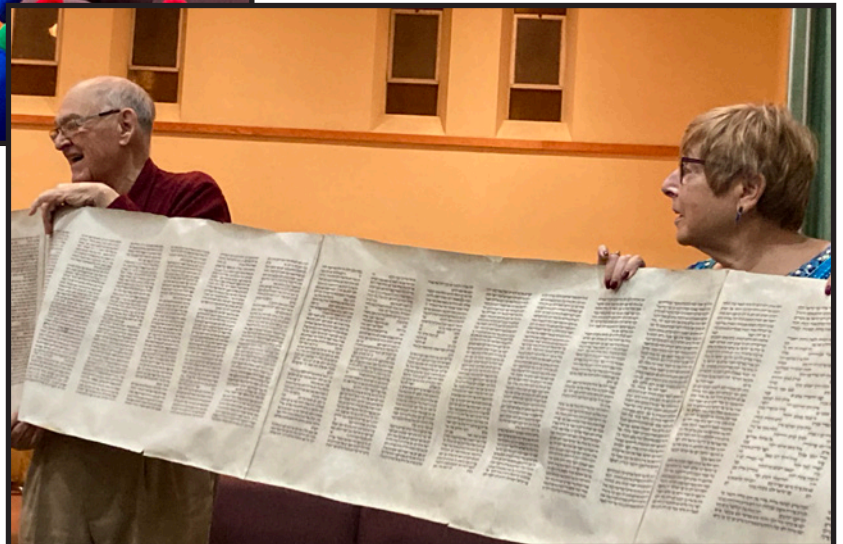

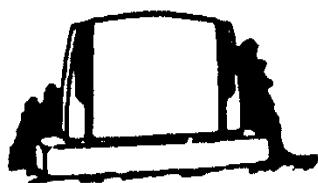

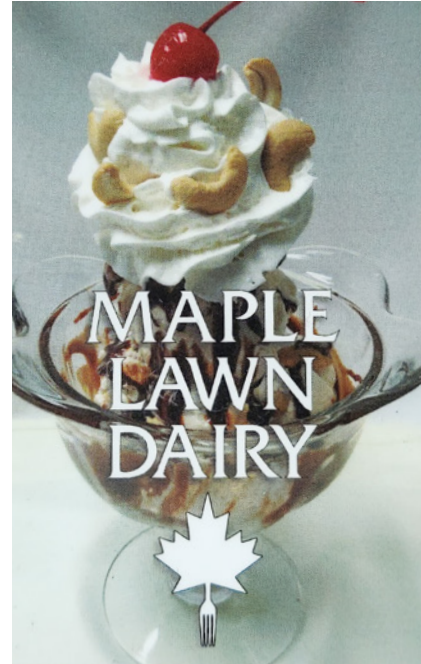
